The six MillionPlus-affiliated modern universities educate more than one in four students studying in Scotland, making them a vital component of the higher education landscape in Scotland; their reach is wide in every sense of the word.<sup>2</sup>





### Research and innovation with impact and reach

- 57% of research that takes place at modern universities is judged to be world-leading or internationally excellent.<sup>3</sup>
- 56% of the research that takes place at modern universities is judged to be world-leading or internationally excellent in respect of its impact in the real world.<sup>4</sup>
- Modern universities provided contract research to over 668 organisations in 2021–22.

### Increasing opportunity and driving social justice

Modern universities have a fundamental role in all local communities in Scotland, making higher education an option for people for whom it was previously out of reach.

- A third of Scottish Universities are modern, and they account for 55% of undergraduate entrants from the most disadvantaged backgrounds and 67% of full-time mature students.<sup>5</sup>
- Students articulating from college to university has widened access and progression within higher education. 46% of first-degree students from the most deprived parts of Scotland come through the HNC/HND college-to-university pathway.<sup>6</sup>
- 52% of all care-experienced students were studying at a modern university in Scotland.<sup>7</sup>
- The reach of Scotland's modern universities extends internationally with 53% of undergraduate transnational education delivered by modern universities.



## Strengthening and enhancing public services in Scotland

- Modern universities are fundamental to the success of public services, with high numbers of students in education that leads to a position as a public services key worker.
- Modern universities have partnerships with all NHS Boards in Scotland and educate:

#### Business partners and economic drivers

- Modern universities account for 48% of all Scottish graduate startups and 35% of all social enterprises in higher education.
- 59% of all graduate apprenticeships in Scotland are done at a modern university.<sup>8</sup>
- Modern universities provided consultancy to more than 554 businesses in 2020–21, over half of which were SMEs.
- All modern universities provide entrepreneurship training and seed corn investment to support startups either on campus or through a partnership.

- It is estimated that, just based on their expenditure, Scottish modern universities contribute over £1.2bn to their regional economies per annum and are responsible for over 9,000 jobs.9
- Modern universities are responsible for 53% of Knowledge Transfer Partnerships being delivered by Scottish universities.<sup>10</sup>



#### Educating students for the industries of tomorrow

- Modern universities offer a broad portfolio, blending traditional subjects such as engineering, science, healthcare, but also pioneering the offer of new and emerging subjects.
- Technology sector businesses contribute £21.6bn to the Scottish economy, employing over 83,610 people.
- In 2021, the creative industries contributed £4.6bn to the Scottish economy, employing over 90,000, one of the fastest growing sectors of the economy.<sup>11</sup>
